Financial Aid at Syracuse University

Syracuse University offers financial aid in the forms of merit-based scholarships, need-based grants and student employment, as well as student and parent educational loans.

Each year approximately 70 percent of all admitted undergraduate students receive financial assistance. Syracuse University will award students financial aid to the extent that funds are available. However, the University does not guarantee that the full need of all students will be met.

While you do not have to file for financial aid to receive a merit-based scholarship, all other financial aid is based on need. Applying for need-based financial aid at Syracuse University requires two separate application forms:

Filing Deadline: February 1, 2007
- **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)** available at www.fafsa.ed.gov
School Code: 002882
Filing Deadline: February 1, 2007

Early Decision Financial Aid Deadlines:

CSS/Profile November 29, 2006

FAFSA February 1, 2007

Both of the above forms should be completed as early as possible in the application process. **Note: the FAFSA will not be available until January 1, 2007.** If your 2006 tax returns are not completed by the above filing deadlines, you should complete the financial aid application using estimated information.
