Discovery Strasbourg Grant is provided to all students participating in the Discovery Strasbourg semester to cover the increased personal costs of studying abroad. It is applied to your account as part of your overall financial aid package

Health Insurance \$2,474

This mandatory fee may be waived if student has adequate private health insurance.

Program Fee

- All students placed with host families and receive 12 meals weekly
- A unlimited semester tram and bus pass
- Extensive support system to respond to student needs
- General orientation, cultural activities, and All-school field trips
- Syracuse Abroad Insurance includes emergency travel insurance
- Membership with International SOS Assistance, a medical and security advisory service
- Pre-departure materials and advising
